Viveca Koh – A Collection of Moments




- Viveca will discuss several of her 'mini projects'

- During his working career, Allan was a professional photographer, specialising in advertising and editorial photography
- Since retirement, he focuses on his personal projects on the Sussex landscape
- Work from his series, Downland Gloaming, was included in the recent Sussex Landscape: Chalk, Wood and Water exhibition, at Chichester's Pallant House Gallery
- His work is also in the permanent collection of the Towner Gallery in Eastbourne.

Allan Grainger – A Pathway to Landscape Photography



Allan will chat about his photographic beginnings, and his time in advertising; the talk will continue with a discussion about his collection of images from Downland Portfolio, which contains Downland Gloaming, Downland Impressions, and The Ouse. The talk will cover the influences that inform his work, such artist Eric Ravilious, the poet Edward Thomas, Pictorialism, and the impact psychogeography has had on his methodology.

He will also be talking about his earliest forays into photography on a local newspaper, his long journey to recognition, and the platform that has given him to create subsequent work.
