My Life in Pictures



- Elizabeth describes some recent work:
- In 2019 as an Artist-in-Residence at Parham House in West Sussex, I returned to my photographic roots. I spent a year photographing the Jacobean Manor House and Walled Gardens with an 8x10" view camera. I produced salted paper and cyanotype prints for the exhibition.
- In 2022 I shot a project at the Booth Museum of Natural History in Hove on 8x10, creating a series of salt points that became *Endangered Species*. This was exhibited in London. Last year it was part of my Victorian Modern Exhibition in Arundel with the Zimmer Stewart Gallery.

- In the second half of her talk, Janey will look at an ongoing travel-based project.



Street Photography: how to feel the fear, do it anyway, and get great images



Caroline says:

People have often said to me that they really like my street photography, but then the next words which follow are something along the lines of I am not brave enough to do it myself. What they don't realise is that I am not brave and I still get butterflies.....and this is normal. Many top street photographers still have nerves.

In this talk I hope to take you on a journey which will look at what street photography is; what makes a great street image; some simple technical stuff on how to capture and produce your street images; and some thoughts on style. I will also talk about confidence and share techniques and tools which will help you manage your nerves and enable you to go out and get great street images.
